Dear Parent / Guardian,

I need you to help our school be as safe as possible. Please keep me safe during loading and unloading by following the procedures listed below:

- I need to use the front entrance when I am dropped off and picked up.
- <u>NO CELL PHONE</u> use while picking up or dropping off. Our staff will enforce this rule by politely reminding you to discontinue use during loading and unloading.
- Escort me into the building ONLY WHEN NO OTHER ADULT IS SUPERVISING, and tell Mrs. Jeresa of my attendance.
- I need to be in the school by <u>7:55</u> A.M. This is when our day begins. There will be announcements for us on the intercom every morning.
- If you are bringing me to school after 8:10, you must sign me in at the front office.
- Upon arriving at school, keep a safe distance from the sidewalk where my friends are walking. REMEMBER: <u>DO NOT</u> pass other cars in the drive.
- Park in the extra parking lot if you need to enter the school.
- Do not have conversations with the teachers or other parents while picking me up. This slows down the release process and frustrates other parents.

Parents and visitors are always welcome here at I.S. and we encourage you to come eat lunch with your child.

MID-SOUTH HEALTH SYSTEMS CHILDREN'S SERVICES SCHOOL-BASED MENTAL HEALTH PROGRAM

School Based Mental Health (SBMH) programs provide services to children/adolescents who have been identified as having behavioral and/or emotional problems that impact their ability to function optimally in the classroom. Brennon Dickson, Astrid Stringfellow, and Sarah Lipsky are the SBMH therapists on our campus. Our SBMH programs are a true collaborative effort between a school district and Mid-South Health Systems. All our school based programs in Craighead County are backed by the SBMH Network, which is under the auspices of the Arkansas Department of Education (ADE). The development of the SBMH Network is supported by the ADE's willingness to promote mental health services with professionalism, quality, and accountability. Most services are funded through the Arkansas Medicaid Program including the Arkids First Program. However, a unique aspect of our collaboration with the SBMH Network is that services are provided regardless of student or family Medicaid or third-party enrollment.

REFERRAL PROCESS/ADMISSION CRITERIA

Many of our partnering schools have what are called Family Service Meetings once a week which allows a school based team to communicate about the needs of students and their families. The school based team includes the principal, school counselor, school nurse, therapist(s), case manager(s), and other child-serving agencies such as Juvenile Justice and the Division of Children and Family Services. Most referrals for school based mental health are generated through this process; however, when a school is not actively practicing Family Service Meetings the referral can come directly from the school counselor or principal. Generally in every school, the school counselor is the central contact person for all referrals. Once a child is referred, the parent or legal guardian is notified by the school counselor to explain the reason for the referral and to inform the family that they will be contacted by the therapist to set up the initial assessment. Based upon a thorough assessment conducted with the therapist and the family, a level of care and appropriate services are determined. Criteria for admission includes a diagnosis of an emotional and/or behavioral condition as listed in the DSM-V and parental consent for treatment.

A Resource for your child

Dear families,

Hello! My name is Katie Beth Lovell (Mrs. Lovell), and I am the Librarian at International Studies. Some of you may be familiar with me because I taught your student in first grade! Every student at I.S. has a 40 minute library class per week. In the past, class time consisted of a brief lesson or story, followed by students selecting their own library materials, and then having quiet reading time at the end. This year we will still have lessons, stories, and time to read, but I will also be implementing use of our "Lightbulb Lab." In this lab students will be able to think, draw, build, design, create, write, and share. This will be a creative and collaborative opportunity embedded into their library curriculum.

Lesson plans and other sites and resources will be posted and linked on my webpage, islib.weebly.com. Students may access our library catalog (Destiny) from that site by clicking on the icon for Destiny on my page. A detailed guide on how to use the library program is posted on their library google classroom page.

Your student will begin checking out library books immediately. Please encourage them to be responsible in keeping up with and taking care of their library books. They will be able to take the books home, as long as they are returned in time for class the next week. They are free to re-check books if they want to finish them, or simply love the book, but they must still bring the book to class so I can document that it has not been lost. We do not charge fines for late materials, but a replacement cost must be paid if a book is LOST or DAMAGED BEYOND REPAIR.

Each student needs to know their gmail log-in information in order to access the Destiny library program. If they are uncertain about this, they can email me at katiebeth.lovell@jonesboroschools.net.

The Jonesboro School District provides a library software program called Destiny. With this software, students may search their library catalog anywhere they have internet access. Individual students have a log-in name and password, enabling them to have their own account to create lists, do safe online research, save research files, and search many different databases .

Students may access Destiny by going to the following web address: library.jonesboroschools.net, then choosing their correct campus. Students may

select the tab "Catalog" to search for books, OR log in to their account which launches Destiny Discover, a more student-friendly version, allowing the student to have many resources at their fingertips. If they are looking for materials on a certain topic, Destiny shows them books available in the library with the ability to reserve them or put them in their list, safe articles on the web, and One Search databases with the related information. They may also access Destiny from Mrs. Lovell's web page, which is islib.weebly.com.

The Destiny Quest app may be put on any electronic device (smart phone, tablet, ipad, etc.) with web access. After loading the app, connect with the URL portal library.jonesboroschools.net. After connecting, log in with the individual username and password. The student will stay logged in every time they open the app unless they sign out manually.

With an increase in digital technology, such as electronic books (ebooks), students may also want to install the app for Follett Digital Reader on their tablet or smartphone. From the app store, install the app entitled "Destiny Discover." The guest log-in is username: hurricane, password: flags OR the student may log in to their own account with their normal Destiny log-in. You should be able to access all of the ebooks we have available through our library program with this app, as well as download your own copy of the ebook. If you have any problem accessing this material, please see Mrs. Lovell in the library.

INTERNATIONAL STUDIES TRAFFIC REGULATIONS

- Safety first! PLEASE observe ALL traffic regulations! They will be enforced by the Jonesboro Police Department. <u>NO CELL PHONE</u> <u>USAGE WHILE IN CIRCLE DRIVE!!</u>
- 2. ALL students who meet their ride on campus are subject to the following rules and regulations:
 - a. Grades 1-6 car riders are picked up on Cobb Street using the Front Door Exit.
 - b. Exceptions must be submitted in writing to the principal for approval.
 - c. Day Care Van riders are picked up at the Back Door Exit.
 - **d.** Back Door Exit will be used by BUS riders and DayCare Vans ONLY.
- 3. Please observe all traffic signs:
 - a. ALL students are REQUIRED to cross at CROSSWALKS.
 - b. Cobb Street is One Way to the North.
 - c. Rains is One Way to the South
- 4. Be considerate of others:
 - a. This is not a good time for visiting—get'em and go!
 - b. In circle drive, stay in the middle, no passing, and DO NOT pull on the curb.
 - c. Pull as far forward as possible in circle drive in the morning and afternoon.
 - d. Have your children ready to exit the vehicle in the morning when you pull up to the curb.
 - e. Come to a complete stop before your child opens the door.
- 5. IMPORTANT things to remember:
 - a. DO NOT leave vehicles unattended.
 - b. Please wait in line to load. PLEASE do NOT "leapfrog" other vehicles and pull to the curb.
 - c. Please **display the card** with your child's name and grade in your vehicle window.
 - d. When exiting circle drive, please do not turn left.
 - e. NO CELL PHONE USAGE IN CIRCLE DRIVE.
- 6. Students who leave campus without an adult are considered "walkers". A note MUST be on file with the homeroom teacher. All walkers are dismissed after the traffic has cleared.
